What Does Carbon Negative Mean For You?

As a Carbon Negative supplier, your sustainability goals are in reach. We can help you reduce your scope 3 emissions.

Our tonnes of CO2 emissions per employee and per £M turnover have been reduced since our baseline year based on our ongoing 3P sustainability strategy action plan, which will continue to be our focus for reducing CO2 emissions as we move towards our long-term goal of being net zero by 2030.

Creating Order Efficiencies to Reduce Emissions

We work with our customers on order efficiencies, by encouraging them to consolidate their orders where possible, to reduce the number of small orders

Any orders less than £30n value, incur a 'Small Order Eco Charge' in a bid to eliminate multiple small deliveries that increase delivery miles and CO2 emissions.

The 'Small Order Eco Charge' collected throughout the year is used towards our carbon offsetting initiatives, such as planting trees or investing into renewable energies.





Optimising our Bryson Delivery Fleet

In April 2022 we welcomed 2 Electric Vehicles (EV's) into our Bryson delivery fleet. As a result of this change we save over 11 tonnes of CO2 carbon emissions a year! Imagine what a full fleet of electric vehicles can achieve.

Our goal is to have a fully electric Bryson delivery fleet by 2030. This change will provide a green Bryson fleet, which will on average remove over 100 tonnes of CO2 from our roads each year!



Looking forward, our goals for an improved delivery fleet include:

Increase deliveries carried out by a Bryson van

A later Bryson van within London (10am – 6pm)

Continue to increase our delivery success rate

Improve our routes & increase our average deliveries

All of these combined efforts mean less time spent on the road, therefore less CO2 emissions!





Optimising our Bryson Delivery Fleet

Our Bryson delivery fleet are Fleet Operator Recognition Scheme (FORS) Silver and CLOCS accredited. We also run high tech systems for optimising route planning & delivery success rates with Maxoptra. This means we're operating our fleet safely, efficiently and in an environmentally sound manner.










With the above in place we have **increased our average deliveries by 15%** and increased our **delivery success rate by 8%**, meaning more goods delivered to your sites. We spent **less time** on the road therefore **reduced our CO2 emissions by over 20%**, making your deliveries greener.

Waste Management & Recycling

We have partnered with a leading waste management company ACM for a number of years on their Greener Path Programme - a unique, holistic and totally sustainable waste management strategy. We have achieved Zero Waste to Landfill every year, meaning a diversion of up to 100% of waste from landfill via efficient recycling and energy recovery.







By diverting waste to landfill and recycling any cardboard and plastic waste we have saved over **70 tonnes** of carbon over the last 5 years.





Waste Management & Recycling

Making every delivery green.

In 2022 we successfully launched our plastic free direct packaging initiative, which was aimed at removing all single use non-recyclable plastic from our Bryson packaging.

The initiative includes our new Bryson brown boxes (printed with 70% less ink), paper and cardboard packing instead or plastic bubble wrap, paper packaging tape instead of plastic, and sugar cane eco mailing bags instead of polythene.



It started in 2019 when we replaced bubble wrap with shredded cardboard boxes where possible. The cardboard predominantly comes from goods received from our manufacturers and suppliers that would otherwise go to recycling.

As a result, we have **reduced** the amount of bubble wrap **plastic used by 80%**. That's the equivalent of 22 football field lengths of plastic removed every year!

Since then we have changed our direct packaging to be **fully plastic free**, by eliminating our plastic packaging tape and reducing the amount of ink printed on our boxes which affects the recycling process. We've also introduced carbon neutral sugar cane eco mailer bags.

Working on indirect packaging

Partnering with more sustainable suppliers has provided us with new packaging ideas and solutions. We are actively working with all our key suppliers to find alternative packaging solutions which are plastic free, recyclable, and more sustainable.





Waste Management & Recycling



Bryson are one of the only companies in the construction industry to offer proper recycling of PPE. We have partnered with a leading specialist in the destruction and recycling of all PPE used on construction sites to provide a circular economy where everything is re-used, recycled and responsibly destroyed - and the best part is NOTHING goes to landfill!

Plus your brand identity is safely destroyed for your own intellectual property protection.

We offer a **simple solution** that suits all sites great or small. We can recycle all your textile PPE (such as hi vis clothing, workwear, face masks and gloves) as well as all plastic, polymer and metal PPE (such as helmets, safety specs, safety boots and ear defenders).

No contract needed – simply contact us when you need PPE recycling



An average PPE recycling breakdown:

20% goes into Tier 1, 60% goes into Tier 2, and 20% into Tier 3. This means that 80% of PPE is recycled and formed into other products!

Tier 1 – Cottons, Wools, Tensels, Mono-Blend Fabrics

Tier 2 - Polys, Nylons, Complex Blends

Tier 3 – polyester fabrics or used for energy





Waste Management & Recycling

We have partnered with well established social enterprise schemes to help eliminate waste, re-use and recycle, and most importantly help communities across the UK.

The Community Wood Recycling project is one such scheme.





We recognise that we have a responsibility to the environment beyond legal and regulatory requirements. We are committed to reducing our environmental impact and continually improving our environmental performance as an integral part of our business strategy and operating methods. Ethical Sourcing

Bryson operates a preferred supplier procedure and maintains a preferred supply list, with due diligence conducted on all suppliers before allowing them to join the supply chain. Our supply chain qualification process checks whether any suppliers have been convicted or had a noticed served upon them for infringement of The Modern Slavery Act 2015 (our statement policy can be viewed here).



Being Sedex members gives Bryson full line of visibility when it comes to supply chain traceability, auditing & due diligence.

We have a robust process in place for supply chain vetting and due diligence, so you have complete peace of mind that we have the best interests in mind and ask our suppliers to become Sedex members. Working directly with Sedex



members means all the due diligence checks have already been made and we're confident we are partnering with responsible and ethical businesses.

Bryson controls and manages activities to ensure risks to ethical and legal requirements are identified and actions are taken to eliminate or minimise their effects.

Bryson are committed:

- To comply with its legal obligations under the current Health, Safety and Welfare Act, Environmental Protection Act and other European Acts, regulations, policies, and laws.
- To promote health, safety, and environmental awareness throughout the organisation.
- To maintain a safe and healthy working environment for its employees, with adequate facilities appropriate to the nature of the business activities.
- To ensure all suppliers fully comply with the principles outlined in our Ethical Trading Code of Conduct.
- To minimise the social impact of the company activities and avoid damage to the environment through regular reviews of the business from environmental and management systems audits.
- Our suppliers' factories are Worldwide Responsible Accredited Production (WRAP) certified.





De-risking our Supply Chain and Supporting UK Manufacturing

Bryson's directors have had a goal since 2018 to create a sustainable supply chain outside of China. Through the COVID pandemic we were thankful to have pulled out most of our supply chain from China and redirect our sourcing efforts to more ethical and sustainable manufacturers.

In Q1 2021 we placed our last order direct with China which was a key milestone as a business.

In 2021 for the first time, were 0% reliant on China for direct spend and 25% reliant on indirect spend, with a goal of **0% indirect spend**.



Further efforts to de-risk our supply chain are focused on supporting local British manufacturing by sourcing products that are locally sourced in the UK. Overall, this supports our drive for a more sustainable supply chain, but it also helps to reduce carbon footprint by reducing long-haul shipping.

Our Sustainable Procurement Policy is one of the ways in which Bryson demonstrates its commitment to being the leader in sustainable development. Further information about our policy can be viewed here.


